Asthma First Aid

Sittheperson upright

- Be calm and reassuring
- Do not leave them alone



2 Give4separatepuffsofblue/greyrelieverpuffer

- Shake puffer
- Put 1 puff into spacer
- Take 4 breaths from spacer

Repeat until 4 puffs have been taken

Remember: Shake, 1 puff, 4 breaths

OR Give 2 separate doses of a Bricanyl inhaler (age 6 & over) or a Symbicort inhaler (over 12).



3 Wait4 minutes

 If there is no improvement, give 4 more separate puffs of blue/grey reliever as above

(OR give 1 more dose of Bricanyl or Symbicort inhaler.)



4. If there is still no improvement call emergency assistance (DIAL OOO)

- Say 'ambulance' and that someone is having an asthma attack
- Keep giving <u>4 separate puffs</u> every <u>4 minutes</u> until emergency assistance arrives

(OR 1 dose of Bricanyl or Symbicort every 4 minutes - up to 3 more doses of Symbicort).



Call emergency assistance immediately (DIAL 000)

- If the person is not breathing
- If the person's asthma suddenly becomes worse, or is not improving
- If the person is having an asthma attack and a reliever is not available
- If you are not sure if it's asthma
- If the person is known to have Anaphylaxis follow their Anaphylaxis
 Action Plan, then give Asthma First Aid.

Blue/grey reliever medication is unlikely to harm, even if the person does not have asthma
