WELCOME TO 2023

I would like to welcome everyone back to Francis Jordan for 2023. I especially welcome our new families to our wonderful school community.

This year my role continues to be in curriculum development from Pre-Kindy to Year Six as well as working more closely with our junior primary teachers and families. Megan Woodall, our new Assistant Principal, will guide the Religious Education domain of our school as well as provide guidance to our upper primary teachers and families where needed.

For 2023 we have several specific curriculum goals. These can be summarised (without the teacher talk!) as:

Literacy:

- Further develop our work in the Science of Reading, particularly focusing on the language structures strand of the reading rope by making syntax and sentence level writing and comprehension a priority in teaching and learning.
- Incorporate structured daily reviews into literacy block (semester 2).

Numeracy:

- Further develop the launch, explore, summarise model of teaching problem solving.
- Implement the practices and structures of a 'Thinking Classroom'.
- Continue to develop number talks in maths lessons to develop mental strategies and fluency.

We will continue to be guided by the work done with Dr Paul Swan and Ben Saulsman from the Catholic Education Office
