Dear Parents and Caregivers

Our Years 6 students have had a wonderful camp experience and they have shown great perseverance with the hot conditions. I was luck enough to spend the day with them on Thursday and to participate in some of the wonderful opportunities. Everyone one was giving 100% to all of the different activities and the word was the food was fantastic. A lot of the planned sessions are designed to have the children working cooperatively, stretching their comfort zones and taking risks. They have done climbing activities, flying fox, paddling, building a catapult, participating in circus skills, orienteering, archery, and ten pin bowling.

A huge thank you to Mr. Purcell, Mrs Clarke, Mr Giannasi, Mr Elek and Mrs Frichot for giving of their time to be with the children over the three days. I am sure that they will come back with wonderful memories that will live on in their lives.

Our Years 3 and 5 will begin NAPLAN testing on the 15 of March. This is a lot earlier than usual as in previous years it is completed in term 2. The reason for the change is to get the results back to school a lot earlier than usual so that we get more time to analyse and use them. NAPLAN is only a small window into the children's development and should only be used as an indicator of where they are at in the subjects tested. The usual program is one test per day done in the morning over the first four days of the testing period. It usually starts with the writing test, followed by reading, spelling and grammar, and then Maths. All of the tests except the Year 3 writing test are completed on the students iPad. The Year 3 cohort compete the writing test using pen and paper. If any students are absent on any of the days of testing, they are able to sit the test when they return to school.

These forms can be collected from the Front Office or if you call early enough it can be emailed to you for your convenience. These notifications are meant to be sent in prior to the day off.

IT ISSUES

Please Note: as per previous notifications, (last year and this year) we do not have an operational Canteen on-site anymore. Parents if you are ordering Lunches for your child/children, PLEASE MAKE SURE you order before 8.30am and that your order has actually gone through. We have had a few students come up and insist their parent has ordered their lunch, but they are not recorded on the sheet that accompanies the Lunch Orders. As we no longer have an operational Canteen, Parents will be called to bring their child/children's lunches.

Please make sure that your Child/children's classes are also on the order.

As our Canteen is no longer operational, students are expected to bring their own Recess.



MEDICATION AT SCHOOL

Should your child require medication to be administered at school, the correct documentation must be completed.

'Over the counter medication' – Student Medication Request/Record Appendix 1 is to be completed and signed by a parent.

'Prescription medication' – Medication Instructions from Prescribing Doctor Appendix 2 is to be completed and signed by a doctor. Additionally, Student Medication Request/Record Appendix 1 is to be completed and signed by a parent.

Medication must be provided in the original packaging.

Both of these forms are available from the class teacher, front office and on our school website.

ANAPHYLAXIS AND ALLERGIES

Anaphylaxis is a severe allergic reaction that is potentially life-threatening. The most common causes of anaphylaxis in schools are food and insect allergies. The only way to prevent allergic reactions is to avoid being exposed to the allergen.

Our school is supporting students at risk of anaphylaxis in the following ways:

training staff,

encouraging students with a food allergy to wash their hands before and after eating,

encouraging students to wash their hands after eating something their classmate/friend is allergic to,

teaching students not to share food,

teaching students the importance of getting help immediately if their friend with an allergy looks sick educating students about allergies and anaphylaxis, and teaching students that teasing someone with an allergy is not acceptable behaviour.

Food allergy is now common in school aged children. Children can be allergic to any food, and it is not possible to completely remove all foods from our school. We have chosen not to stock nuts and nut products, as these foods are not staple foods in the diet and we request that parents do not send nuts or nut products to school. We are an Allergy Aware School.

As we educate our school community to help with the management of food allergy and anaphylaxis, the parents of the student with a food allergy will continue to educate their child on self-management at a developmentally appropriate level.

We ask you to support the school's risk minimisation strategies that can be found in our Anaphylaxis and Allergy Management Procedures on our school website, so that we can increase safety and provide an environment that meets the needs of all our students.
